#### 03. Read the following text and do the activities that follow it.

Rabies is an ordinarily infectious disease of the central nervous system, caused by a virus and, as a rule, spread chiefly by domestic dogs. Man and all warm - blooded animals are susceptible to rabies. The people of ancient Egypt, Greece and Rome thought rabies to be the work of evil spirits because ordinarily gentle and friendly animals suddenly became violent without evident cause and, after a period of wild behavior, became paralyzed and died.

Experiments carried out in Europe in the early nineteenth century proved that the disease was infectious. Preventive steps, such as the destruction of stray dogs, were taken and by

1826 the disease was permanently eliminated in Norway, Sweden and Denmark, although urban centres on the continent of Europe were cleared several times during the nineteenth century, they soon became reinfected since rabies was uncontrolled among wild animals.

During the early stages of the disease, a rabid animal is most dangerous because it appears normal and friendly, but it will bite at the slightest provocation. The virus is present in the salivary glands and passes into the saliva so that the bite of the infected animal introduces the virus in to a fresh wound. If no action is taken, the virus may become established in the central nervous and finally attack the brain. The incubation period varies from ten days to eight months or more, and the disease developed more quickly the nearer to the brain the wound is. Most infected dogs become restless, nervous and irritable and vicious, then depressed and paralyzed. With the type of rabies, the dog's death is inevitable and usually occurs within three to five days after the onset of the symptoms.
