Kitty: So when do we use the present simple?

Gran: Well, for things we do every day, every week or every

month. Tell me what you do every morning.

Kitty: I wake up, I get dressed, I eat breakfast, I brush my teeth,

I feed Hero the hamster and then I go to school.

Gran: Well done! Oh, I remember when I was a girl...Hey, you're

not listening!

Kitty: Look Gran, Hero's playing with your knitting!

Gran: Oh no! What a mess!
