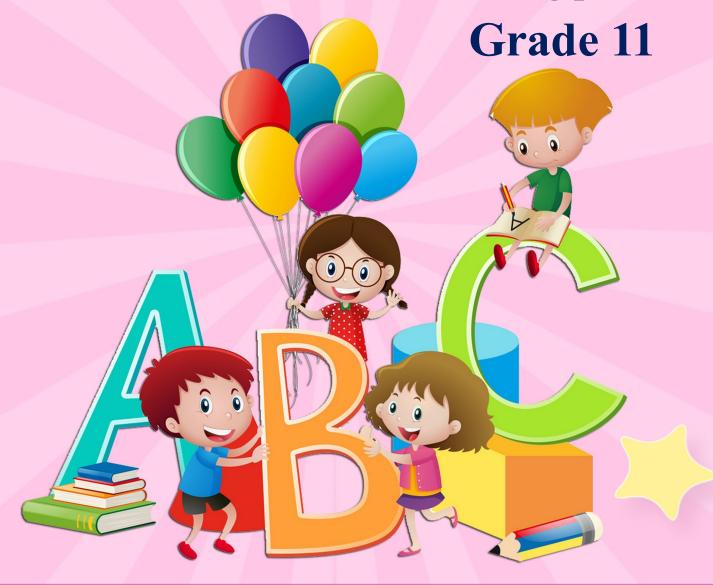


Competency level - 4.5 Forms the plurals of nouns.

Nouns

Singular means only one thing or person plural means more than one thing or person (two or more)

To change a singular noun into plural, there are changes in spellings as well as pronunciation. Let's see the spelling changes.

The singular nouns, which end in -s, -ss, -sh, -ch, -x are made into plural by adding -es to the end of the singular noun.
