- D. Scarlatti

## Giuseppe Domenico Scarlatti (1685 – 1759) Italian

#### **About:**

•Harpsichordist during the Baroque period



#### Main works:

- •Scarlatti composed over 500 sonatas for the harpsichord.
- •He was also a virtuoso in Harpsichord music.

### Johann Sebestian Bach (1685 – 1750) German

#### **About:**

- He hails from a family of seven generations of musicians.
- •Organist, harpsichordist, violist, and violinist of the Baroque period.
- •His life was divided into 3 main periods namely-Weimar, Cothen, and Leipzig.
- •Became blind towards the latter part of his life.

- •Orchestral works "Air on a G String"
- Harpsichord works Among his last major works were the
- "Goldberg" variations for harpsichord.
- •BWV is the name used to catologue his works.

## George Frideric Handel (1685 – 1759) German



#### **About:**

- •Performed as: Harpsichordist, organist, and violinist
- •Spent most of his life in London
- •Became blind towards the last seven years of his life, but continued to conduct Oratorio performances.

- •Oratorio The Messiah (Hallelujah Chorus which is considered to be the giant of Oratorios.)
- •Opera Rodrigo, Almira and Rinaldo
- •"Water music" Suite
- •The Harmonious Blacksmith –
