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

- In such cases, instead of criticizing the Holy Church, you can overcome the obstacles to your faith by praying for the church leaders.
- The reluctance of today's youth to develop spirituality and witness to the faith, not being able to go to Sunday school due to Sunday support classes/Tuition classes.
- The Sunday School attendance will help understanding the true value of Holy Eucharist and relying on God to overcome their personal challenges.
- The programs, circulating in the internet disturb the faith of the people.
- Christians go after superstitious beliefs.
- To know that living in accordance with the ten commandments, one is able to overcome challenges in life.

- 1. The divine vision/ encounter
 - The prophet sees a very complex vision. It is symbolic of God's mysterious presence.
- 2. The passage of 1.5 in Ezekiel, entrusting prophetic mission. The divine inspiration is symbolic of the power prophet receives to initiate his mission.
- 3. The prophet shows reluctance to accept the mission
 The prophet is assigned to preach to his hard-hearted people in the exile. (Though the prophet is reluctant to face the arrogant people, God encouraged him.)

- 4. God gives the folding book in his hand to eat, written inside in both sides. It is unusual and it means that it has been written under the divine revelation
- 5. The prophet is sent.

Sent to a revolutionary, stubborn set of people who were in exile. Ezekiel is sent to change their hearts (change their heart of stone into flesh). His main responsibility is to share the Word of God to everyone.

• Experiencing rejection

To bear witness to the truth in the face of injustices in society like Christ, and to be rejected.

- <u>Facing the challenges of working in a multi-religious, multi-cultural society</u>

 The challenges of working in a monotheistic society amidst different religions.
- <u>Influence from fundamentalists.</u>

The influence of fundamentalists in dealing with monotheism is exemplified by the strong challenge of the lay people being victims of fundamentalists.

Orientation to worldliness.

Willingness to give into the temptations of desires for wealth, power and fame with inclination and attachment. Then one's spiritual life will be disappearing.

Depression

The effects caused by the multiplicity of tasks in carrying out one's responsibilities. A state of mental illness due to stress caused by the compulsion to commit time and effort.

- Moses asked, "Who am I to go to Pharaoh and bring the people of Israel out of Egypt?"
- If they also asked me what his name was, and I asked what I should tell them.
- They did not believe me and did not listen to my voice and asked what if the Lord did not appear to you.
- "I am not a fluent speaker. The weakness of my hearing. The tongue is stuttering." Said Moses.
- "Oh my Lord, please send someone else of your choice."

(ii)

- Believing in Divine Providence in the face of every challenge.
 Just as the people of Israel experienced Divine Providence in various ways during their journey from slavery to the promised land. It is pointed out that we can overcome challenges by experiencing Divine Providence and trusting in it in the face of challenges that come our way.
- Refrain from complaining and cursing in discouraging moments and helplessness in life.

Despondent and helpless in the wilderness, the people of Israel cursed God and Moses, and fell prey to poisonous snakes. It shows us that we should not complain and slander God even in times of discouragement and helplessness in our lives. We must live in faith.

• Experience God's love in prayer

Moses raised his hands in prayer during the battle between the Israelites and the Amalekites in the Exodus, showing us that we can experience God's love in our daily prayers. Prayer is essential to life.

Surrender to Divine Providence in true conversion

By accepting our sinfulness and having a true conversion, we can truly repent of our sins and receive the treasure of God's grace in union in the sacrament of reconciliation.

• Believing that God has a plan for each of us:

Just as God led the people of Israel to the Promised Land. Let us trust in God's plan by knowing our needs and strengthening us in His plan.

(i)

- The purpose of St. Matthew is to point out that Christ is the deliverer that the Jewish people have been waiting for from age to age.
- Jesus is presented as the awaited Messianic teacher, just like the new Moses. For this
 reason, he has compiled the teaching of Christ into five main sermons (like the
 Pentateuch of the Old Testament).
- Just as Moses was the mediator of the law given at Mount Sinai; Christ establishes a new law in the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:1). Christ also gives eight principles like Moses' Ten Commandments (Matthew 5:3-10).
- Matthew, who gives more place to the work of Christ's teaching than other events, gathers the various teachings of Christ and presents them in a systematic manner.

• It also indicates that Jesus is the new law giver and completes the law and he is the teacher of the law. (Matthew 5:17) There presented five sermons of Jesus.

(ii)

- If they are members of Buddhist children, I will tell them that the Beatitudes of our religion presented by Christ is similar to Noble Eightfold Path to inherit the Kingdom of God.
- The goal of every human being in the world is to be blessed, and that a simple life is necessary to reach it.
- Living with good manners can lead to rejection from the rest of society. One should know it.
- The values of God's kingdom: peace, harmony, mercy. acceptance of others. Realizing that I should practice the qualities of loving even my enemies, living justly, being humble, humble, etc., and being an example by practice in the same way is desirable.
- By living with these qualities will bring us happiness, joy, peace, luck, and that God will not give up even in the midst of some pain and suffering.

The principles, constitutions of the human world should be related or brought closer to the principles of God's kingdom Christians should strive for it.

(i)

From his life:-

- He is an Augustinian priest.
- He is a professor at Wittenberg University.
- Frustrated with the various activities that were going on in the Church.
- Opposed the Pope's sale indulgence to finance the construction of St. Peter's Basilica.
- Exhibition of an indictment in Wittenberg Cathedral, objecting to 95 points, including the trade of indulgence.
- Vatican gave Luther 60 days to withdraw his charges.
- He was excommunicated from the Holy See, because he did not withdraw the charges and he founded the Lutheran Church.

From his teaching:

- The salvation is possible only through faith.
- There are only two sacraments instituted by Jesus Himself (Baptism and Holy Eucharist)
- The church exists though the participation of all the faithful.
- One should not be a slave to others except to Christ.
- The center of Christian life is the Divine Teaching and Holy Bible.
- The priesthood is valid for both male and female, and they can get married.
