In its journey around the Sun, the Earth is accompanied by its satellite, the Moon. Next to the Sun, the Moon appears to us to be the largest body in the sky. It seems to be larger than any star or planet that we can see. Its **(01) apparent** diameter is about equal to that of the Sun. Actually, the Sun is very much larger, with a diameter 400 times greater than that of the Moon. But the Sun is 400 times more **(02) distant** from the Earth. This is why the Sun and the Moon appear to be about the same size.

Next to the Sun, the Moon is the brightest object in the sky. However, that is only because it is so near to us. In fact, it only **(03) reflects** the light of the Sun, and that is why we see the Moon shining at night. Different parts of the sunlit side of the Moon can be seen at different times. We can **(04) observe** the Moon apparently changing its shape from a crescent to a full circle and then back again to a **(05) crescent**. When the Moon is between the Earth and the Sun, it cannot be seen. Several days later in the **(06) phase** known as the New Moon, we see the Moon becoming a thin crescent and getting wider until it reaches the phase called the First **(07) Quarter**. The Moon is now **(08) partially** lit, and we see it looking exactly like a semicircle. Sometimes we see the reflection of the Sun's rays from the Earth dimly lighting up the rest of the Moon. We notice this happening especially when the Moon appears as a thin crescent. This **(09) phenomenon** is called 'Earthshine'. When the Moon is on the opposite side of the Earth from the Sun, it becomes a fully **(10) illuminated** disc, and this phase is known as the Full Moon.

1. Dr. Asha de Vos, an internationally celebrated Sri Lankan marine biologist, has dedicated her life to exploring and protecting the world's oceans. Educated at Ladies' College and Colombo International School, her fascination with the sea eventually took her to the University of St Andrews, where she completed her undergraduate degree in Marine and Environmental Biology. She later pursued an MSc in Integrative Biosciences at the University of Oxford and earned her PhD from the University of Western Australia—becoming the first and only Sri Lankan to obtain a doctorate in marine mammal research.

2. Asha's groundbreaking work began with her discovery of a resident blue whale population in the Northern Indian Ocean, a finding that positioned her as a pioneer of long-term blue whale research in the region. Her role as Principal Investigator brought together international scientists to address the critical issue of ship strikes on blue whales, leading to a major peer-reviewed publication and recommendations she presented to the Sri Lankan Prime Minister.

3. Despite her strong academic background, Asha stepped outside traditional academia to establish 'Oceanswell', Sri Lanka's first marine conservation research and education organization. Through 'Oceanswell', **she** works tirelessly to inspire and empower future ocean custodians while **advocating** for diversity and equity in marine conservation. Her contributions have earned wide international recognition, with features on BBC, TED, National Geographic, and The New York Times.

4. Her accolades include the Global and Regional Professional Achievement Awards from Study UK Alumni Awards in 2018. She is also the first Sri Lankan woman to have her portrait hung at Oxford University, and a deck on the MV Sylvia Earle cruise ship proudly bears her name a tribute to her extraordinary impact on ocean science.
